I. CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL – The meeting was called to order at 6:05 pm.

MOTION: Dorfman to accept the Agenda as presented (Croyle 2<sup>nd</sup>). Vote 3-0

V. PUBLIC COMMENTS/PRESENTATIONS: None

VI. CONSENT CALENDAR:  
A. Minutes of November 16, 2005.

MOTION: Dorfman to approve the minutes as presented (Landis 2<sup>nd</sup>). Vote 3-0

VII. DIRECTOR’S REPORT/INFORMATION ITEMS – No action required. Boucher went over his portion of the Director’s report by giving an update on the following issues: Main & Radcliffe Intersection; Underground Utility District 7; Harborwalk Project; City Council Town Meeting; Fire Station Apparatus Bay; Sewer Collection System Master Plan; Urban Water Management Plan and Calendar Year 2005 Water Consumption.

Croyle observed that for a few hundred dollars the City could direct traffic on Highway 41 under Highway One and onto the dedicated lane on Highway One through to Main and Quintana instead of having them turning left onto that portion of Main that intersects with Radcliffe.

VIII. OLD BUSINESS: None

IX. NEW BUSINESS:

A. Urban Environmental Accords: Boucher gave his presentation and recommended the Board consider the matter and report to the City Council their suggestions for the City's implementation of the Green Cities Declaration.

General discussion followed and included the following topics: The vagueness of the document, what pertained to Morro Bay, mechanism of scoring on implementation of accords, letter from Board Member Croyle, solar panels on government buildings, waive or lower building permit fees for private solar power installations, vital issues of sustainability, having staff use the accords as a source document for staff reports, how to keep this issue from falling through the cracks, stricter tree ordinance, ecological tourism, transportation, hydrogen vehicles, bio-diesel fuel, worm bins, and other issues.

MOTION: Dorfman to recommend City Council endorse staff report as a fair evaluation of city's current implementation of the 21 items in the Green Cities Declaration (Croyle 2<sup>nd</sup>). Vote 3-0

MOTION: Dorfman to recommend to City Council to pass a Resolution endorsing the spirit contained in the Green Cities Declaration (Croyle 2<sup>nd</sup>). Vote 3-0

MOTION: Landis to recommend to City Council, whereas the 21 actions are not all directly applicable to a city our size and it is not feasible to have a plan around each action, but many items are applicable. Therefore, we recommend the City Council, with City Boards and Commissions, direct staff to identify a minimum of 3 items for action over the next six months (Dorfman 2<sup>nd</sup>). Vote 3-0

X. FUTURE AGENDA ITEMS: Sewer Master Plan Update, Crosswalk Request, Urban Water Management Plan, and Election of Chair and Vice Chair.
